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### Homework

Reading: As always, reading is an essential part of your child's education and works as a partnership between school and home. The children have quality reading time regularly where they read to an adult and receive feedback, as well as reading lessons and reading activities. Please encourage your child to read every night, or as much as possible. Questioning them on the book they are reading is an effective way to help develop their reading skills. There is a bookshelf placed in your child's reading record where they should write the book title on once a book has been completed. When 3 books have been written on to the sheet, they will then receive a raffle ticket and be placed in to the reading prize draw.

Maths: Each week children will be set a maths task online. The children will have any logins they need to access this task. Homework will be set on a **Friday** and should be returned on **Monday please**. The maths task set will **consolidate** learning in the classroom and will not be new learning. If your child struggles with any of the activities, please let me know, so that we can go over things in class.

Reading task Homework: NEW for this year! In your child's redesigned reading record is a grid of homework tasks relating to a book they are reading. These are to encourage engagement in the text. Your child can choose one from the grid, tick it and complete it on the weekly page in their reading record, which they will hand in on the Monday morning.

**Spellings:** A weekly home learning spelling task will be sent home each week on **Friday**. Children will be familiar with the content of this, having learnt the spelling rule several times in class that week before the task comes home. There will be **no weekly spelling** test.

#### P.E

Children will be able to attend school in full PE Uniform on their 2 timetabled PE days - Wednesday and Friday. PE Uniform is plain white t-shirt, plain black shorts or plain black jogging bottoms, plain black sweat top and plain black trainers. Pumps/plimsolls are not required. Plain black trainers are allowed to be worn instead of school shoes, however if you prefer to send your child to school in school shoes, then they must also have plain black trainers with them for impromptu active sessions.

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#### What to bring/What not to bring

- Clear pencil case with pencil, rubber, sharpener, glue stick, yellow highlighter and red pen please
- Please bring school bags, reading books and reading records every day
- Children should also bring a named water bottle in daily
- Children may also bring a piece a healthy snack to school for playtime
   Alternatively, you can contact the office to order a daily snack and/or milk.
- Every alternate Friday (Please see the Foxhill Newsletter for further details)
  children may bring in achievement certificates, badges or trophies rewarded at
  home, to show in our Celebration Assembly.
- Please do not bring/wear jewellery (except studs), nail varnish, mobile phones, large hair pieces or toys.
- Please double check your child's name is in all uniform, coat, P.E Uniform and school bag.
